CARICOM	Under the project ' <i>Technical Support to CARICOM Member States in ratification and implementation of the Arms Trade Treaty</i> ' CARICOM organizes a regional workshop and establishes a regional coordinating mechanism to accelerate ATT ratification.
RECSA	Under the project ' <i>Mobilising RECSA Member States to sign, ratify and implement the Arms Trade Treaty (ATT)</i> ' RECSA undertakes regional advocacy and consultative conferences and public awareness events on the ATT.

Chatham House	The project ' <i>Maximizing the Potential of the Arms Trade Treaty: supporting Treaty ratifications leading to early entry into force and effective implementation</i> ' assists States in understanding the broader policy implications and advantages of ratification of the ATT by developing four policy papers.
