CARICOM	Under the project 'Technical Support to CARICOM Member States in ratification and implementation of the Arms Trade Treaty' CARICOM organizes a regional workshop and establishes a regional coordinating mechanism to accelerate ATT ratification.
RECSA	Under the project 'Mobilising RECSA Member States to sign, ratify and implement the Arms Trade Treaty (ATT)' RECSA undertakes regional advocacy and consultative conferences and public awareness events on the ATT.

Chatham House	The project 'Maximizing the Potential of the Arms Trade Treaty: supporting Treaty ratifications leading to early entry into force and effective implementation' assists States in understanding the broader policy implications and advantages of ratification of the ATT by developing four policy papers.
Institute for Security Studies	Under the project 'Arms Trade Treaty and UNPoA implementation and compliance support' ISS organizes workshops in Swaziland, Lesotho and Malawi to discuss ratification of the ATT.
